Additions To Teaching Staff

New Monarch Waystation

Former Carden Conejo student, Daniel Cashdan, is a senior at Viewpoint school. He is also in the process of achieving the Eagle Scout rank in Troop 718. His Eagle Scout Service Project has been to design and install a monarch butterfly waystation habitat in the corner of our Primary School playground. Here, migrating Monarch butterflies can find protection and food while migrating to their overwintering areas.

He and 14 family and friends worked over the weekend to install this butterfly sanctuary.
