Students Visit Classrooms

On Wednesday, August 28th at 11:00 am, all students are invited for a brief visit with their new teacher and classmates. Parents should accompany their children entering Pre-School, Pre-K, Junior K, and Kindergarten. Parents of children in upper grades may come but it is not required. A postcard was mailed to all students on August 22nd notifying them of their new teacher. Elementary school students <u>do not</u> need to wear their school uniform on the visitation day.

First Day of School

School starts on Thursday, August 29th. This will be a full academic day for all grades.

Grades K—5 should wear their weekday uniform.

Friday, August 30th will be our first Assembly day. Students in K—5th are to wear their Friday dress uniform. Parents are welcome to attend Assembly in the auditorium. Students in 2nd—5th grades should bring their P.E. clothes or their weekday uniform to change into for P.E. class.

Town Hall Information Meeting

On **Thursday, August 29th**, all parents are invited to the school auditorium, after dropping their child off, for a Town Hall Information Meeting. Ms. Lisa Macias-Flavin will welcome everyone and provide some information about the upcoming school year.

The CCPA leadership team, and the after-school enrichment programs and the hot-lunch program will be available for questions.

School Uniforms for Elementary School (K-5th)

Our school uniform provides security and consistency to each child's daily routine. When all families are held accountable for the same clothing and grooming requirements, children are able to concentrate on learning and enjoying all that school has to offer. The school's traditional dress code also promotes a sense of modesty and decorum among the students. Please read the regulations carefully and help your youngster to follow them.

<u>New uniforms</u> can be purchased at Mills Uniforms (800-541-1850 or <u>www.millswear.com</u> use the school code: 106). <u>Gently used</u> <u>uniforms</u> can be purchased from "<u>La Boutique Carden</u>." located here on campus. Purchases are contributed to the CCPA.

Girls: Kindergarten—Grade 3

Monday—Thursday:

Sailor dress, white cuffed socks reaching above the ankle, and white leather sport shoes. Girls shoes are to be all white, or white with black accents/sole sports shoes. An acceptable black accent would be the Nike 'swish' or the Adidas bars. Girls will attend P.E. class in their weekday uniform Monday— Thursday (no changing into P.E. clothes). On cold days, girls may also wear navy blue tights.

Friday:

Plaid jumper, white "Peter Pan" blouse, red tie, navy blue blazer with the school crest, navy blue knee socks, black or navy buckle or tie dress shoes. On cold days, girls may also wear navy blue tights. On Fridays, girls in grades 2 & 3 may change into P.E. clothes or into their weekday uniform for P.E. class.

Hair and grooming guidelines

Hair of shoulder length or longer must be fastened back so it will not fall over the face. Hair-bands, scrunchies, ribbons, and clips must be school colors (red, white or blue). Bangs should not hang below the eyebrows.

Girls' and boys' fingernails should be cut short and kept clean. Fingernail polish may be worn if the polish is not chipped.

Only one simple bracelet and a watch may be worn. Students may not change or lighten their hair color. Hair extensions, beaded hairstyles and trailing head scarves are not permitted.

No valuable watches or jewelry will be allowed. No smart watches. The school is not responsible for lost or damaged items.

No body or facial piercing will be allowed. Dangling earrings are not permitted. No make-up for students will be permitted.

Girls: Grade 4—5

Navy blue skirt or navy blue slacks, blue, red or white school polo

shirt, white socks reaching above the ankle, and white leather

Friday:

Plaid skirt, button-down white oxford shirt, red school tie, navy blue blazer with the school crest, navy blue knee socks. Black or navy buckle, tie, or loafer-style dress shoes. On cold days, girls may also wear navy blue tights. On Fridays, girls may change into P.E. clothes or into their weekday uniform for P.E. class.

Boys: Kindergarten—Grade 5

Monday—Thursday:

Navy blue walking shorts or slacks, worn with a red, blue, or white school polo shirt. Plain navy, black or white socks reaching above the ankle, are to be worn with black leather sports shoes. Boys shoes are to be all black, or black with white accents/sole sports shoes. An example of an acceptable white accent would be the Nike 'swoosh' or the Adidas bars. Boys will attend P.E. class in their weekday uniform Monday— Thursday (no changing into P.E. clothes).

Friday:

Gray slacks, white button-down oxford shirt, school plaid tie, navy blue blazer with the school crest, black or navy blue dress socks, and black or navy blue dress shoes. Boys in Grade 5 may wear loafers. On Fridays, boys may change into P.E. clothes or into their weekday uniform for P.E. class.

Student Drop Off and Pick Up Procedures

Drop off, pick up and parking continue to be an ongoing issue for those who reside in the neighborhood of Carden Conejo School. Since the first week of school is traditionally somewhat hectic, we would like to remind all parents to please observe the following drop off and pick up procedures.

Please begin your entry on Triunfo Canyon Road, turning onto Silver Spring, to join the line of cars waiting to enter the school driveway (please see the map for clarity.) It is customary to wait in line on Silver Spring and follow the car in front of you. As you pull into the school driveway, your child will be escorted out of the car in the morning and into the car in the afternoon. It is important that you wait for the car in front of you to pull out of the parking lot before you leave. This prevents a lot of chaos.

Any variance on this route is unsafe for the children and creates a traffic problem for other parents and community residents. Please do not park and walk your children to the school. Also, U-turns on Silver Spring are both illegal and unsafe, and left turns into the school driveway on Evenstar are not permitted.

For the safety of all children, parents and teachers, please do not use your cell-phone at any time while in the drop-off line, and until after you exit the school driveway.
